

GLOBAL 1HN MASTER'S LEVEL BURSARY AWARD

(up to \$11,250 per year, up to two years)

The One Health Network for the Global Governance of Infectious Diseases and Antimicrobial Resistance (Global 1HN) is pleased to announce its first competition to support graduate level (MA, MSc, MPH, etc.) students, conducting research relevant to at least one of the four Research Enabling Platforms (REPs) identified as priorities by the Network. The goal of Global 1HN is to strengthen Canadian leadership in improving the global governance of infectious diseases (IDs) and antimicrobial resistance (AMR) by building and sustaining a transdisciplinary and intersectoral One Health Network, originating in Canada but extending globally, with a focus on the Americas. As part of this, the Network aims to enhance research capacity for conducting interdisciplinary research on the global governance of IDs and AMR using a One Health lens. The One Health approach, in this context, refers to designing and implementing programs, policies, legislation, and research in a way that enables multiple sectors and stakeholders engaged in human, animal, plant, and environmental health to communicate and collaborate to achieve better health outcomes.

The research focus of the Network is divided along four REPs: (1) detection; (2) response; and (3) institutionalization in the global governance of IDs and AMR; while systematically considering aspects of (4) equity. The purpose of the Master's level bursary awards is to provide financial assistance to Master's students to contribute novel knowledge (for example through systematic and scoping reviews) and to develop case studies for testing various governance evaluation frameworks identified by Global 1HN members.

Criteria for Application

- Students must submit the application form, describing how their research will contribute to the goals of Global 1HN.
- Only students enrolled at a Canadian university in a graduate level program will be eligible for this award. They may apply in advance of acceptance into a program but must be accepted in the program for the award to take effect.
- Students must submit an academic CV with their application form.
- The proposed project should be interdisciplinary, integrating elements from both social and health sciences.
- The research must be aligned with the research priorities identified by Global 1HN and should complement work already conducted under one of the REPs of the Network
- Applicants may complete the application form in English or French.

Requirements of MA Bursary Recipients

Students who are granted a Global 1HN Master's Bursary will be expected to participate in one of the following:



- the Network's annual meeting (location within Canada to be determined annually)
- the Network's Summer Institute (2 sessions in total to take place in 2021 and 2023, in locations within Canada to be determined)
- a student exchange across the research sites of Global 1HN or with our European partner,
 SoNAR Global)

All costs of participation in these activities will be covered by the Network.

Application Process and Deadline

Students must submit their complete and signed application form, along with their curriculum vitae by email to Corinne Packer at: cpacker@uottawa.ca. The deadline for submission of applications is March 31st, 2020. Decisions will be announced by May 15th, 2020.
